

RUSH FACT SHEET

Since its founding nearly 170 years ago, Rush has been a national leader in academic medicine. In 2007, Rush was named a "Top-Performing Hospital" by University HealthSystem Consortium (UHC), an alliance of 97 academic medical centers, which placed Rush among the top five medical centers in the nation for the third year in a row. And in the July 2007 *U.S. News & World Report*, Rush was ranked in more specialties than any other hospital in Illinois. Rush has also twice been awarded Magnet designation by the American Nurses Credentialing Center in recognition of the excellence of its nursing services. In many areas of medicine, Rush offers treatments available nowhere else. It is this caliber of medicine that draws people to Rush from throughout the Midwest and around the world.
