

# Patients Rank RUMC Much Higher than Union Hospitals in Illinois



NNOC/NNU organizers often talk about “*putting patients first*” and how hospitals should prioritize “*patients over profits.*” While these are *catchy taglines*, in reality, they are largely meaningless.

When you look at the data on **the percentage of patients who would recommend hospitals to their family or friends**, the data clearly show that patients rank unionized hospitals much lower than RUMC.
